GENERAL TIPS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

- Follow the rules of conduct and Russian legislation. Respect the rights of others.
- Keep documents and valuables in a secure place.
- Make and save copies of your documents
- Extend your visa and registration on time!
- Always carry with you:
 - Passport
 - Registration slip
 - Migration card
 - Student ID



- Be understanding of the instances when you are asked to present your ID and belongings for inspection.
- Save Useful Contact Numbers:

 - ✓ Centre for International Student Mobility;
 - ✓ International Student Support Centre;
 - ✓ Embassy;
 - ✓ Insurance company;
- Check with your insurance company about where and how you can receive medical care

- 9 Be aware of potential weather and climate-related risks (abnormally low or high temperatures, etc.)
- Be aware of possible household issues (faulty appliances, broken furniture, etc.)
- Try to eat only those foods and drinks whose origins you are sure of. Be wary of unfamiliar products.
- Do not drink tap water



PERSONAL SAFETY

Case 1

You walk along a deserted street at night, listening to music with headphones.

A man comes up to you from behind and places a solid object at your back. He threatens to shoot if you don't give him your wallet and phone.



















Case 2

Police officers stop you on the street and ask for your documents. When you try to find your documents in your bag, you realize that you left them at the dorm. The police officers suggest that you pay a fine in the amount of 10,000 RUB on the spot and promise to let you go.





















Case 3

During the day, you walk along a street holding a phone and texting. There are cafes and shops nearby; it's not very crowded on the street, but you see several people nearby. Unexpectedly, a teenager runs up behind you and tries to wrestle your phone out of your hands.

Personal Safety Tips

When you walk along the the streets, choose crowded places and well-lit areas.

Keep documents and valuables secure by storing them in a safe place.

Beware of people begging on the street.



Avoid displaying your phone, money or other valuables.

Stay away from unfamiliar groups of people and intoxicated individuals.

If someone speaks rudely with you or mocks you, do not respond. Do not let them provoke you.

Do not give your phone number away to an unfamiliar person.

SAFETY IN THE CITY

Case 1

At the metro station, a person accidentally slipped and fell on the rails. An approaching train is not yet seen, but the person seriously injured his leg and cannot move independently. What should the person do in this situation? How should the other people on the platform act? Provide reasons for your answer.











Case Solution

If you are the one injured:

Lay down in the space between the rails



Wait for a metro employee

Case 2

During morning rush hour, you get on the bus. It's quite crowded inside. At the next stop, most of the passengers get off. At the back of the bus, you notice a box standing on a floor and wrapped in tape. There are no passengers next to the unattended item. What should you do in this situation?









Case Solution

Ask people if it belongs to them

Inform the driver about the box



Do not attempt to touch or open the box

KEEP YOUR PERSONAL BELONGINGS IN A SAFE PLACE

HOLD ONTO THE HANDRAILS

PAY YOUR FARE -> YOU RISK A FINE IF YOU DON'T

ALWAYS INFORM THE DRIVER ABOUT SUSPICIOUS OBJECTS AND UNATTENDED ITEMS

IN THE EVENT OF AN EMERGENCY OR SECURITY/SAFETY RISK:

inform the driver immediately

use emergency exits by breaking the glass

ask the driver for a first-aid kit (if necessary)



Metro

DO NOT GET TOO CLOSE TO THE EDGE OF THE PLATFORM

DO NOT ATTEMPT TO RETRIEVE ITEMS DROPPED ON THE RAILS BY YOURSELF

KEEP YOUR PERSONAL BELONGINGS IN A SAFE PLACE

IN THE EVENT OF AN EMERGENCY OR SECURITY/SAFETY RISK:

- If you are located on the platform:
- Inform a police officer or metro employee nearby
- Use the call button located on the emergency assistance box (SOS)

If you are on the train:

- Inform the train driver using the call button (SOS)

CONFIRM THE COST OF THE TRIP ONCE INSIDE




FASTEN YOUR SEATBELTS

DO NOT LEAVE ITEMS UNATTENDED.



IN THE EVENT OF AN EMERGENCY OR A SAFETY/SECURITY RISK...




If you are located within an HSE University building, inform:


