At a dormitory:

- Check into the dormitory; receive your key and a pass card;
- Submit copies of your passport, visa and migration card for registration to the passport specialist on the following working day after your arrival (see further details on p. 14);
- □ Pick up your registration when it is ready;
- Read the Internal Dormitory Regulations (see more details on p. 20);
- Sign the Tenancy Agreement (within two weeks after check-in).

At a rented apartment:

- Make sure that your landlord applies for your registration at the local district office of the Russian Ministry of Internal Affairs upon HSE University's request on the next working day after your arrival (see more details on p. 14);
- Collect a pass card from SIMO.

At HSE University

- Familiarize yourself with the location of HSE University buildings at hse.ru/en/buildinghse/list and by using the Вышка.Навигация арр (for the central Pokrovsky complex);
- Get familiar with HSE University campus life (see more details on p. 35);
- Receive your student ID from SIMO (see more details on p. 28);
- Make photocopies of your passport, registration and migration card;
- Meet your study manager;
- Manage your class timetable;
- Apply for a multiple-entry visa at the Visa & Registration Centre after receiving an e-mail from SIMO (more on p. 16).

Getting Around the City

- Buy a Troika (Тройка) card to use public transport in Moscow (at the metro ticket office) and top it up for either a 60-trip ticket or an unlimited one-month ticket;
- Buy a SIM card for your phone (only after obtaining your registration)
 (see more details on p. 42);
- Apply for a social (transport) card at one of the Multifunctional Centres after receiving an e-mail from SIMO (see more details on p. 29).

Visa and Registration



The information contained in this brochure is accurate at the time of its printing. Please check the Visa and Registration Centre website (visa.hse.ru/en) to find the most up-to-date information.

Keep your passport, registration and migration card with you at all times. Furthermore, we recommend making photocopies of these documents and keeping digital versions and hard copies in a safe place.

Single-entry Visa

The visa shall be issued to you by the Russian Embassy/Consulate in your country of residence. The visa is valid for 90 days only. It lets you enter Russia only once.

To extend your stay in Russia, you will have to apply for a multiple-entry visa (for more information please, see p. 16).

1. When can I travel outside Russia?

Be prepared to stay in Russia without leaving for the initial three months after your arrival. You can travel outside Russia only after you have received the multiple-entry visa.

2. When can I apply for my multiple-entry visa at the earliest?

You may submit your documents no earlier than 90 calendar days before your visa's expiry date.

3. What happens if I go outside of Russia before receiving my multiple-entry visa?

You will not be allowed to return to the Russian Federation until your new letter of invitation is ready. You will need to obtain a new single-entry visa.

4. My family/friends want to visit me in Russia. Can HSE University arrange a letter of invitation for their Russian visa?

HSE University does not sponsor visas for family members or friends. Their visa and registration arrangements must be taken care of independently.

Migration Card

You shall receive a new migration card every time you enter Russia. You must keep it during your whole stay in Russia and present it at passport control when leaving the country.

IMPORTANT! Every time you receive a new migration card at passport control, make sure that the option 'Учёба/Education' is underlined in the card.



What to do if I have lost my migration card?

- 1. Immediately inform SIMO about it.
- 2. If you have a buddy, ask him/her to accompany you to the nearest police station and help you apply for a certificate of loss.
- Submit your passport, a copy of your passport, registration and certificate
 of loss to a Migration Office to receive a duplicate of the migration card.
 This process will take from 5 to 14 days.

Registration

Your registration slip is a confirmation of your lawful stay in the Russian Federation. This shall be arranged by your dormitory/landlord/hotel. You must apply for the registration on the following working day upon your arrival in Russia



How can I get registered?

- If you are staying in a dormitory, submit a scanned copy of all pages in your passport with stamps, marks and visas, along with a scanned copy of your migration card to the passport specialist at the dormitory (p. 20).
 - If you are staying in a rented apartment, ask the landlord to apply for your registration at the local territorial body of the Russian Ministry of Internal Affairs (MVD). The list of necessary documents can be found on the HSE University Visa & Registration Centre's website.
- Pick up the registration in the dormitory or from the landlord of your rented apartment.

During your stay in Russia, there will be several situations when you will be expected to obtain a new registration.

When should I get a new registration?

- After having your 3-month single-entry visa extended;
- Every time you get a new migration card (after travelling outside of Russia or after losing your migration card);
- If you change your place of residence (e.g. move from the dorm to a rented apartment);
- When you return to your dormitory or rented apartment after staying in a hotel (or some hostels) in Moscow or another Russian city, as they will cancel your current registration and issue a new one by default.

Travelling in Russia

You will not need a new registration if your stay in any Russian city lasts less than seven working days. However, every time you stay at a hotel, they will draw up a new registration for you. This new registration cancels your previous registration automatically and you must apply for reregistration as soon as you return to Moscow.

If your trip to another city in Russia takes over seven working days, you must get registered by your hotel/hostel/landlord there. As soon as you are back in Moscow after your seven+ working days' trip, you must apply for a new registration.

Travelling to Belarus

Under an agreement signed on June 19, 2020, citizens of third countries with a valid visa to either Russia or Belarus are allowed to enter, leave and stay in the other country until their visa expires, cross the land border between Russia and Belarus by rail or air, and via major highways.

Travelling Outside of Russia

You can travel outside Russia only after you have received your multiple-entry visa.

When you return to Russia, you will receive a new migration card. You must apply for new registration on the next working day upon your arrival.

Multiple-entry Visa

This visa replaces your single-entry visa and will be extended for the period of your studies at HSE University. However, a student visa may not be extended for more than one year at a time. It allows you to leave and re-enter Russia as many times as necessary for the duration of your studies.

When should I apply for visa extension?

Not earlier than 90 calendar days and no later than 45 calendar days prior to the expiry date of your visa. If you submit the documents later than 45 days before the expiry of the current visa, they will not be accepted.

What documents do I need?

- to be collected by the student:
 - a copy of your passport (all pages with stamps, marks and visas);
 - · a copy of your visa;
 - a copy of your registration slip (both sides);
 - a copy of your migration card;
 - a colour photo (3.5 x 4.5 cm);
 - a confirmation of state duty payment;
- to be collected from SIMO:
 - · a certificate of enrollment:
 - · an extract from your admission directive;
 - a copy of your agreement certified by SIMO (if you are studying on a fee-paying basis).

How can I get my single-entry visa extended?

- 1. Submit your documents to the HSE University Visa & Registration Centre, which will forward them to the Migration Office.
- Your visa will be issued within around 45 calendar days. You will receive a notification from the Visa & Registration Centre once it is ready.
- 3. Leave your passport at the Visa & Registration Centre for 1-2 business days. It will be taken to the Migration Office so that the visa can be stamped into the passport.
- 4. Pick up your passport with the new multiple-entry visa at the Visa & Registration Centre and extend your registration at your place of residence on the next working day (more details on p. 14).

HSE Dormitories



Upon check-in you need to submit to the dormitory administration a health certificate signed and stamped by a physician in your country of residence before your departure to Russia. The form can be downloaded on the SIMO website.

When should I pay for my dorm tenancy?

Rent payment must be made for the next month no later than the fifth of that month. If you arrive in August, the first payment will be in September and include the payment for the days in August when you rented the place.

How can I pay for my dorm stay?

- Sign the contract (within two weeks after you move in).
- Make the payment online via the dorm's webpage
- Or pick up a payment form from the dormitory administration. Fill in your name and pay the fee at a local bank.
- Submit the payment confirmation to the dormitory administration.

Where can I find the passport specialist in my dorm?

Dorm 1: room 205b, 2nd floor

Dorm 4: room 131, 1st floor

Dorm 5: room 107, 1st floor

When can I access the dormitory?

Tenants have 24/7 access to the dormitory. Guests are only allowed to stay in the dorm until 11pm.

According to the sanitary rules and norms, dormitory residents are required to have their bed linen changed once a week. Where can I get a clean set?

Dorm 1: room 101, 1st floor, Mon-Tue: 11 am – 3 pm

Dorm 4: room 123/125, 1st floor, Thurs (see the schedule on the notice board)

Dorm 5: 1st floor, Thurs: 8 am – 3 pm

Can I use electrical appliances in the dorm?

Owing to fire safety regulations, you must avoid using electric irons, hot plates, electric kettles and other electrical heating devices in your room. Please cook only in designated kitchens on the floors.

Can I hold a party in the dorm?

Yes, you can, but you need to receive the permission from the dormitory administration one week in advance. Also, please note that noise is not allowed in the dorm from 11 pm to 7 am. Smoking and consumption of alcohol and drugs are not permitted on the premises.

Can I keep a pet in my room?

No, pets are not allowed.

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All international students are recommended to purchase a health insurance policy **before** arriving in Russia. The insurance plan must be valid in the Russian Federation. You may require medical treatment and doctor's appointments, tests and diagnostic procedures, or even simple health certificate to go to a swimming pool – for all these activities, medical insurance is mandatory.

Check that your insurance plan contains:

- an insurance card:
- insurance plan details (the medical services to which you are entitled);
- payment or reimbursement details;
- your emergency contacts;
- a list of hospitals or medical centres where you can get medical assistance in Russia.

Students can also purchase medical insurance in Russia from HSE University's partner insurance companies. Check the **Office of Staff and Student Benefits** website benefits.hse.ru/en for more information.

Furthermore, the European Medical Center in Moscow cooperates with many international insurance companies, including BUPA International, Allianz WorldWide Care and CIGNA International.

Arrival Form and Learning Agreement

During the orientation session, you will be asked to fill in the HSE Arrival form and the Processing of Personal Data consent form in their original copies. These documents should be submitted to SIMO.

Your home university arrival form and learning agreement must be signed by SIMO and should be submitted via the Online Document Request form.





Student ID Card (available for exchange and visiting students from partner universities)

A Student ID card is an official document certifying that you are an HSE University student.

You can collect your student ID from SIMO after receiving a notification e-mail.



What discounts can I get as a student?

- A student ID allows students to apply for a student social (transport) card, which offers a significant discount on public transport in Moscow.
- A student ID card offers discounted admission to certain museums, theatres, cinemas, clubs, exhibition centres and zoos.
 The student ID also allows for seasonal discounted purchases of railway tickets. On special occasions, certain shops and cafes can offer discounts to students.



Electronic Pass Card

A pass card allows entry to HSE University buildings.

If you stay in the dormitory, you will get a pass card upon checking in.

If you rent an apartment, you can receive your pass card at SIMO.



Social (Transport) Card (available for exchange and visiting students from HSE partner universities)

The Student Social Card can be used as a transport card and allows students to take public transport in Moscow (metro, buses and trams) at a reduced price.

You can start applying for the social card after receiving a notification e-mail from SIMO. Check the HSE University website to learn about the social card application procedure.



Please be aware that, after you submit your social card application, you will have to wait for at least one month until the card is issued.

The social card must be activated and then topped up every month, separately for the metro (at a metro ticket booth) and public ground transport (by using grey transport tickets kiosks or self-service ticket machines at bus stops).





Exit Form

HSE University Exit Form

On the eve of your departure, you are required to submit the HSE Exit Form to SIMO in person or by e-mail.



While completing the document, you will need to:

- go to the library, return the books you borrowed and hand in your library card;
- pay for the last month of your stay in the dorm (if applicable);
- take part in the HSE Student Survey;
- hand in your pass card to SIMO or your dormitory.

Your home university departure form (if applicable) should be signed by SIMO by submitting an Online Document request form.





Transcript

After you have submitted your HSE exit form and finished your stay at HSE University, you will receive an official **transcript of records**, detailing your examinations and results/grades achieved.

When will I receive my transcript?

The transcript draft will be issued within 5 weeks after the official end of the semester and sent to your personal e-mail. After you have approved the draft, SIMO will then send a signed and sealed digital copy of the transcript to you and with your home university's coordinator cc'd.

How can I get a hard copy of my transcript?

A hard copy can be posted to your home university upon request.



HSE UNIVERSITY STUDENT CORPORATE E-MAIL

During your stay at HSE University, all e-mails and notifications from the University staff will be sent there:

- by SIMO;
- by your study manager and professors;

LEARNING MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (LMS)

The Learning Management System (LMS) is HSE University's unified educational environment. It can be accessed at lms.hse.ru

Students use it to:

- enrol for courses:
- study learning materials;
- perform different types of academic activities (uploading assignments and term papers, passing tests, etc.);
- communicate with teachers, programme office and other learners;
- check the grades in the electronic grade book.

STUDY MANAGER

My study manager is:

Every exchange and visiting student can receive academic support from their personal study manager. A study manager is an administrative staff member responsible for organizing educational processes at a faculty. Your study manager will help you with course selection, making changes to your curriculum, and other academic issues.



All international students can take one Russian as a Foreign Language course (any level) per semester for free.

A standard course lasts one semester (two modules). It is comprised of 8 – 10 academic hours per week and is worth a total of six ECTS credits.

Before classes start, students are required to take an entrance test. Students are admitted to the course as per their test results.

Language courses are offered according to the levels of proficiency - from Beginner to Advanced.

Can I take more than one Russian as a Foreign Language course per semester?

Yes, but for a fee.

Can I take the Russian language course only for one module and earn three ECTS credits?

According to the curriculum, Russian classes last for one semester and the course workload comes to six ECTS. Neither the course nor the workload can be split up into separate parts.

Where can I get extra Russian speaking practice at HSE University?

Check the ESN Facebook group for the information about ESN Tandem speaking events.

If you speak Russian at a more advanced level, you can consider joining one of student clubs to practise your Russian with local students.



Library

The HSE University Library comprises about 700,000 items on Economics and Management, Social and Political Science, etc., majority of which is recent works authored by Russian and foreign scholars.

All branches in different parts of Moscow are open to international students. You can find the addresses and working hours at <u>library.hse.</u> ru/en/subdiv/.

The main library branch is located at 11 Pokrovsky Bulvar.

How can I receive a library card?

You will receive it during a library tour, organized during the orientation session.

How do I get remote access to HSE Library e-resources?

Fill in an application form in the 'Electronic Resources and Remote Access' section on the HSE University Library website.

Library etiquette

- Keep quiet;
- Do not talk on your cell phone in the reading halls and turn the phone sound off;
- No food is allowed. Drinks (e.g., water, tea or coffee) are only allowed in containers with a lid:
- Leave your coat in the cloakroom.

The complex at 11 Pokrovsky Bulvar boasts a large canteen, several coffeeshops and a restaurant.

Sports

HSE University's Sport Facilities are offered at most of the dormitories and at the campus buildings at 3 Bolshoy Trekhsvyatitelskiy Pereulok and 11 Pokrovsky Bulvar (a gym).

In order to join any HSE University sport club, a student must present a medical certificate from a physician proving that his/her health allows for doing sports. For more information, please check: <u>istudents.hse.ru/en/sports</u>

HSE University Bookshop

At the HSE University bookshop 'Bookvyshka' you can purchase books published by the University's own publishing house and authored by Russian and international authors on a variety of topics.

You can also find many HSE University souvenirs, such as T-shirts, hoodies, mugs, etc. with the HSE University logo.

The shop has two locations at:

- 20 Myasnitskaya Ulitsa (Mon-Fri: 10 am 8 pm, Sat: 10 am 7 pm);
- 11 Pokrovsky Bulvar (Mon-Fri: 10 am 5 pm, Sat: 10 am 4 pm; lunch break: 1.30 pm – 2 pm).

Student Clubs and Activities

Although most HSE University clubs use Russian as their working language, there are a few clubs and events targeted at the English-speaking student community. You can find more information about them at istudents.hse.ru/en/campus and in the HSE International Students Facebook group.

Bi-weekly 'Culture Cafes', organized by SIMO and ESN, will let you learn about traditions and life in different countries.

Also, several language speaking clubs will help you make friends with students interested in foreign languages and cultures.

Furthermore, ESN monthly trips will show you what Russia is like outside of Moscow – to places like St. Petersburg, Kazan, Murmansk, etc.

Psychological Counselling

International students often encounter difficulties while adapting to the new environment and dealing with culture shock, language barrier, and homesickness all at once. HSE University's Psychological Counselling Centre is always there to provide the students with professional help in English: anonymously, individually, or in groups.

Consultations for students are free of charge.


After working hours, if an emergency arises, please contact the **Centre for International Student Support at +7 985 040 13 55.**

We advise following these basic precautions that apply to living in any big city:

- always have a copy of your passport with a visa and your original registration on you;
- watch out for pickpockets in crowded places;
- keep an eye on your luggage while travelling;

- store your valuables (money, credit cards) in a wallet in zipped pockets (on clothes or in a bag);
- always know how to get home late at night (the time of the last train/bus or the telephone number of a reputable taxi service);
- do not react to verbal abuse/invitations;
- do not stay late at night in an isolated place with people you do not know.

Mobile Services

You can use your own mobile phone number if your provider has a roaming agreement with a Russian mobile company. However, to avoid roaming charges, you can purchase a Russian SIM card from one of the stores operated by the top four nationwide mobile phone service providers in Russia.

The Moscow Metro is efficient, fast and easy to use. Almost all stations have signs translated into English, however, only a few of them are wheelchair accessible. All metro lines have their own colour and numbers. All radial lines intersect the brown circle line. Metro entrances are marked with a large red letter 'M'.

Students can use their social (transport) card to use the metro at a reduced price. Other fares and tickets are also available at metro ticket booths.

The metro is open from 6 am to 1 am.

Be sure to follow the metro safety guidelines:

Keep an eye on your belongings and pockets, especially in crowded areas.

On escalators: stand on the right side, pass up or down on the left side holding the handrail; stand behind the protective strip. Never sit or place objects on the stairs of escalators; do not run along them or step on an idle escalator.

On platforms: stand away from the platform edge until the train comes to a full stop, and after it stops, step to the side, away from the doorway to let other passengers disembark. Never descend onto the metro tracks or put items on them.

In coaches: do not lean against the doors, or open them while moving; let passengers to get on and off the train freely. Do not use the 'passenger – driver' intercom system unless necessary. Never place luggage on seats. Always hold the handrail while in a moving train coach.

Ground Public Transport

Moscow's ground public transportation system includes buses, trolley buses and trams.

Students can use their social (transport) card on all types of public transport. If needed, you can also purchase tickets from drivers, in kiosks near the stops or use a contactless bank card or Apple/Samsung Pay on your smartphone.

Travel cards for both ground and underground transport are also available for purchase in metro stations.

Ground transport operates from 5.30 am until 1 am. There are a few night routes.

Bus stops are marked by yellow plates marked with "A" signs, trolley stops – white plates with "T", and tram stops – white plates with "Tp".

Taxi Services

We highly recommend that you use official taxi services. While there are illegal taxis in Moscow that may offer a cheaper alternative, we strongly advise against using them, as they may be unsafe. Hitchhiking is not recommended either.

Uber is available in Moscow. Other useful apps are Gett Taxi and Yandex. Taxi.

Aeroexpress Trains

The Aeroexpress provides rail services between the city centre and all of the major Moscow airports:

- Vnukovo (via Kiyevsky Railway Station),
- Domodedovo (via Paveletsky Railway Station) and
- Sheremetyevo (via Belorussky Railway Station)

Aeroexpress is a quick and safe way to reach the airport without having to deal with traffic jams.
